



2015.07.24.CPP Code of behaviour for nursery and primary pupils

The school is a community and the school rules are an expression of the need to safeguard the rights of all members of the school community, individually and collectively. The rules have been made in order to create the best conditions possible for the school to be a place of learning, of personal development and of preparation for membership of a democratic society for each pupil. Breaking of school rules shows disrespect for other members of the school community. The school wishes to cultivate self-discipline, positive attitudes, positive self-esteem, tolerance and co-operation in every pupil.

Each pupil has the right to:

- be encouraged and treated with respect
- be given the highest chances of progression in his/her school life.

Without the active support of the parents in preparing their child for school, the school cannot adequately perform its task of educating a pupil to the best of his/her ability. The school expects parents to make sure that their children are ready and willing to learn and that they behave in a respectful and considerate manner to other pupils and staff.

1. The Timetable

School starts at 8.55 when pupils are allowed to enter the school and ends at 16.25 after the last lesson on Mondays, Thursdays and Tuesdays and ends at 13.10 on Wednesdays and Fridays.

Pupils are requested to keep strictly to these times. When changing classrooms pupils will walk in a reasonable manner to their new class.

2. The Lessons

It is the responsibility of the teacher to create a positive learning environment in the class and to ensure that the individual pupils progress as far as his/her abilities will let him/her. The pupils must concentrate on the work in class and do the homework assigned to them. If pupils do not live up to this responsibility it will not be possible for the teacher to do the job to the best of his/her ability.

3. Absences

Acceptance of a place at the European School entails an obligation to attend all classes. A pupil's attendance at classes is necessary to ensure his/her academic and personal development and to enable the teacher to make a full and accurate assessment. There are only 180 school days in a school year.

4. Use of the school buildings and grounds

Riding of bicycles, skateboards etc. is forbidden in the playground.

It is not allowed to climb on the roof for any reason.

Pupils may not sit on the tables.

5. Dangerous objects

Dangerous objects (knives, matches, lighters) must not be brought to school.

6. Cleaning

It is the responsibility of all members of the school community to keep the school a clean and tidy place. All rubbish must be put in dustbins.
