

The European School Bergen (NL) is a 4-19 school in the town of Bergen Noord-Holland, and it is one of the 13 Type 1 European Schools in Europe which offer a European education leading to the final European Baccalaureate certificate. The European Schools have their own curriculum which is the same in all the language sections.

Job offer:

From **1 September 2020** the European School Bergen is looking for the following teachers in the **Secondary Cycle**:

1. Teacher of Music

(job reference number: 2020-05)

- An enthusiastic and experienced teacher of Music to teach all levels in secondary, including the European Baccalaureate
- The Music lessons are in mixed ability groups, and will require differentiated learning strategies
- An interest in the development of whole school music activities (eg. Choir, music groups, orchestra, bands, school productions etc.)
- Ability to teach another subject (e.g. Art, ICT) would be of interest to applicants who wish to have a full timetable
- Good team-work with other teachers is expected
- Approximately 18 lessons per week are available (full-time is 21 periods of 45 minutes).
- Good skills in the following areas are essential: planning, ICT, oral and written communication in English. Desirable – Dutch and/or French

2. Teacher of English Mother Tongue and Philosophy in English (part time) (job reference number: 2020-06)

- A qualified, enthusiastic and experienced teacher of English mother tongue (L1) and Philosophy in English in the upper secondary classes, including the European Baccalaureate, with a willingness to teach other levels, including English as a Foreign Language
- The teacher should be a native speaker of English
- The English lessons are in mixed ability groups, and will require differentiated learning strategies
- Good team-work with other teachers is expected.
- Approximately 9-12 lessons per week are available (full-time is 21 periods of 45 minutes), although more may be available depending on subjects offered (e.g. see the advertisement below for Latin)
- Good skills in planning and ICT are essential.

3. Teacher of Maths and/or Physics in the English Section (full or part time) (job reference number: 2020-07)

- A qualified, enthusiastic and experienced teacher of Maths and Physics to teach all levels, including the European Baccalaureate
- The teacher should be a native speaker of English, or provide evidence that they are at least C1 level in English. All lessons are taught in English.
- The lessons are in mixed ability groups, and will require differentiated learning strategies
- Good team-work with other teachers is expected
- A full time job is available (21 lessons per week). It can be shared by two teachers- one teaching Maths and the other one Physics.
- Good skills in the following areas are essential: planning, ICT

4. Teacher of **Chemistry and/or Biology** in the **Dutch Section** (full or part time) (job reference number: 2020-08)

- A qualified, enthusiastic and experienced teacher of Chemistry and Biology is required to teach the subjects to all levels, including the European Baccalaureate.
- The teacher should be a native speaker of Dutch, or provide evidence that they are at least C1 level in Dutch. All lessons are taught in Dutch.
- Approximately 16-20 lessons per week are available (full-time is 21 periods of 45 minutes).
 The job can be divided between two teachers, one for Chemistry and the other Biology.
- Good team-work with other teachers is expected.
- Good skills in planning and ICT essential.

5. Teacher of the Lithuanian Language Mother Tongue (part time) (job reference number: 2020-09)

- A qualified, enthusiastic and experienced teacher of Lithuanian mother tongue, to teach in secondary, including the European Baccalaureate in the future
- Good team-work with other teachers is expected
- Good planning and ICT skills are essential
- Basic knowledge of English and/or Dutch is needed
- Approximately 6 lessons per week are available (full-time is 21 periods of 45 minutes).

6. Teacher of Latin

(job reference number: 2020-10)

- A qualified, enthusiastic and experienced teacher of Latin (English and/or Dutch) to teach all levels in secondary. Please indicate the language(s) of tuition you would be able to offer
- The Latin lessons are taught in mixed groups, and will require differentiated learning strategies.
- Good team-work with other teachers is expected.
- Approximately 10-14 lessons per week are available (full-time is 21 periods of 45 minutes).
- Good skills in the following areas are essential: planning, ICT

Contract:

The contract is in principle for two school years in the first instance.
